Patient Event at St Columba's Church March 5th

We were delighted to welcome over 300 patients to this, our first Patient Engagement event, co-hosted by Selborne Road Surgery and the Crookes Practice.

The aim of the afternoon was twofold, we wanted our patients to be aware of the opportunities available locally, we know many of our patients are lonely or isolated, we know many are at a loose end since retiring so we invited lots of local organisations to come along and show patients what was available, free of charge on their doorstep we wanted to showcase hobbies and activities, or just give people an opportunity to widen their circle of friends. ADHD Medication

Over the last few years we have been asked to prescribe ADHD medication for people diagnosed by private companies as part of an agreement called Shared Care. We have been overwhelmed by the demand for this service which is unfunded and unresourced, it is simply not sustainable for us to continue with this. In addition our GPs are being asked to prescribe a specialist drug they are unfamiliar with which poses a risk to the patient and our Doctors,

For these reason and because of the increasing demand for these medications we have taken the difficult decision to stop agreeing to any new private Shared Care requests, we will continue to honour existing agreements and requests from NHS clinicians where we consider it safe to do so.

Private Letter Requests

Our NHS contract requires us to look after people who are ill, people who are at the end of their lives and people with long term conditions.. There are other services we provide for additional payment so that we can employ staff to deliver them.

We do not provide private GP letters, we have around 20 requests each week which we have to decline as we will not be able to do our NHS work if we provide these letters, it would amount to 2 sessions of GP time in which they could see 24 patients.
